REGULATIONS FOR CHOICE BASED CREDIT AND SEMESTER SYSTEM FOR UNDER GRADUATE (UG) CURRICULUM -2019

(CBCSSUG 2019 on words)

Ability Enhancement courses/Audit courses: These are courses which are mandatory for a programme but not counted for the calculation of SGPA or CGPA. There shall be one Auditcourse each in the first four semesters. The list of passed students must be sent to the University from the colleges at least before the fifth semester examination. The list of courses in each semester with credits are given below.

* Colleges can opt any one of the courses.

Duration: The duration of a UG programme shall be 6 semesters distributed over a period of 3 academic years. The odd semesters (1,3,5) shall be from June to October and the even semesters (2,4,6) shall be from November to March

Attendance: A student shall be permitted to appear for the semester examination, only if he/she secures not less than 75% attendance in each semester. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10% in the case of single condonation .Participation in activities may be treated as presence in lieu of their absence on production of participation/attendance certificate (within two weeks) in curricular/extracurricularactivities (maximum 9 days in a semester).

Improvement course: Improvement of a particular semester can be done only once. The student shall avail of the improvement chance in the succeeding year after the successful completion of the semester concerned

Open courses: There shall be one open course in core subjects in the fifth semester

Course Evaluation

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts

- 1) Internal assessment 2) External Evaluation

20% weight shall be given to the internal assessment. The remaining 80% weight shall be for the external evaluation.

Internal Assessment

Components with percentage of marks of Internal Evaluation of Theory Courses are-Test paper40%, Assignment 20%, Seminar 20% and Class room participation based on attendance 20%.

INDIRECT GRADING SYSTEM

But no separate pass minimum is needed for internal evaluation). No separate grade/mark for internal and external will be displayed in the gradecard; only an aggregate grade will be displayed. Also the aggregate mark of internal and external are not displayed in the grade card.

Method of Indirect Grading

Evaluation (both internal and external) is carried out using Mark system. The Grade on the basis of total internal and external marks will be indicated for each course, for each semester and for the entire programme.

Centralized Admission Process (CAP)

The admission will be conducted through Centralised Admission Process(CAP). CAP offers facility for online submission of application to various colleges and programmes. Students can opt up to 10 College/Programme options of their choice on priority basis from among the Affiliated colleges through simple online steps available in CAP (website www.cuonline.ac.in). Students can also select 3 more College/Programme options under community reservation. Candidates shall complete the Online Registration using the details provided in the Final Consolidated Grade Card/Mark Sheet. Candidates shall not provide any approximate values/foreseen data for completing Online Registration. In such cases, the application with incorrect data will be summarily rejected and the candidate will be denied allotment/admission (if any) received on providing wrong information.

Allotment:

Trial Allotment

A trial allotment will be conducted to give the applicants an idea about the chances of getting allotment to a programme and college based on the options, merit and reservation rules. The trial allotment does not guarantee the candidate to get allotment in a college or a programme of his/her choice, since the ranks may vary in actual allotment subject to the rearrangement of options by applicants after the trial allotment.

Rearrangement of priority of options. After trial allotment, candidates can login into CAP from the home page and rearrange the options submitted earlier within the prescribed time. The candidates who receive allotment should pay the following mandatory fee (in single E- chalan/online payment) within the time prescribed for confirmation of the allotment.

Remittance of fee

Remittance of Mandatory fee For General Category Rs 480/-

Sports Affiliation Fee : Rs 280/-

University Union Fee : Rs 85/-

Allotment Fee : Rs.115/-

After the payment of mandatory fee, candidates should report and take temporary/permanent admission at allotted college within the time prescribed.

Those who fail to remit the fee and take temporary/permanent admission on or before the prescribed time limit for the same, will lose the current allotment as well as the eligibility for further allotments.

If the candidate is satisfied with an allotment and does not want to be considered for further allotments, such candidates shall cancel all the remaining higher options. Candidate retaining higher options after an allotment is bound to accept the next allotment. Failing to do so, their chance for the previous allotment as well as the new allotments will be cancelled.

Reporting to the College for admission

All the candidates who got allotment and downloaded Admit Card should report for admission on the date prescribed by the University at the college concerned after remitting the fee (University Mandatory Fee - See clause 7.3) .The candidates should produce the following documents in original before the Principal/Head of the institution at the time of admission.

The print out of the online application

Receipt/Chalan of the fee remitted for acceptance of allotment (Mandatory Fee).

Qualifying Certificates.

Mark List(s)/Grade card(s) of the qualifying examination.

Transfer Certificate from the Institution where he/she last studied.

Conduct Certificate.

Equivalency/Recognition Certificate (if applicable).

Any other documents (Nativity Certificate /Community Certificate/Non creamy layer certificate etc.) as directed by the admitting authorities.

Candidates who claim bonus/weightage marks shall produce relevant certificates.

Confirmation of Admission

As the allotment is made based on the information furnished online by the candidate, the eligibility will be confirmed by the Principal/Head of the Institution at the time of admission. The Principal/Head of the Institution will verify the original documents produced, with the details furnished by the candidates in the online application.

Any discrepancies which invalidate the allotment will be informed to the University and in such cases the admission will be denied immediately. The University will also verify the genuineness of the certificates furnished by the candidates in due course of time and any discrepancies noticed will lead to the cancellation of the admission.

Management Quota/Sports quota

Candidates seeking admission to the above quotas in colleges should register in CAP. In addition to this, candidates should contact the colleges he/she intends to take admission and submit separate application in the colleges concerned within the prescribed time limit.

The Colleges shall issue separate application forms to the candidates seeking admissions to the following Quotas.

A community certificate along with the Income & Assets Certificate (Ref: G.O.(Ms) No.128/2020/HEDN Dated 20.03.2020) issued from Village Officers/ Thahasildar should be produced by the candidates who wish to avail of reservation under EWS category at the time of admission. Please see the appendix for Govt. Order G.O.(Ms) No.128/2020/HEDN Dated 20.03.2020 which includes the format for EWS certificate to be obtained from Village Officers.

CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATIONS

Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by the candidate in the relevant column of the online application in CAP. However, the supporting documents shall submit only at the time of admission in the colleges concerned. **The claims for mandatory reservation once made in the Application form cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.**

Claim for Communal reservation under 'Socially and Educationally Backward Classes'(SEBC): Reservation of seats to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O.(P) 208/66/Edn. dated 2.5.1966, as amended from time to time. Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other backward Hindus, Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indians and Other backward Christian communities, claiming reservation under SEBC Quota should invariably produce both '**Community**' and '**Non Creamy Layer Certificate**' obtained from the Village Officer concerned at the time of admission. Candidates whose annual family income is above the amount stipulated by the Government for this purpose from time to time are not eligible for reservation. The seats unavailed by SEBC category candidates will be allotted under open quota.

Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota: Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota should obtain caste/community certificate from the Tahasildar. Admit cards will only be issued to the candidates who takes admission through the allotment process. **No admit cards will be issued to the candidates** who takes direct admission at colleges via rank list provided by the university or through various reservation categories such as PH, Sports, Management, Community,

Lakshadweep etc.

Students who have successfully completed a Regular PG programme will not be permitted for an additional PG programme in the regular mode. Additional P.G can be taken in all subjects but only through the SDE or Private mode, provided they are eligible as per other criteria of SDE/Private admission.

All the corrections including change in marks after the closing date of online registration, on account of revaluation, improvement and addition of grace marks etc, will be considered only after the second allotment.

No fees in advance shall be collected from OEC students/students belonging to communities eligible for education concession as given to OEC category (U.O.No. 2593/2020/Admn dated 26.02.202

ADDITIONAL PROGRAMMES

- (1) **Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP)** is conducted to impart skills for easy employment of graduate students.
- (2) **Walks with a Scholar (WWS)** scheme is implemented to arrange Specialised mentoring programmes for selected students in under graduate programmes.
- (3) **Scholar Support Programme (SSP)** conducted for under graduate students to provide additional academic support.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) is a noble academic extension programme envisioned at national level, with a view to bring our academic institutions closer to the society. It is an educational programme for personality development of the students through community service. The basic concept of National Service Scheme is to give an extended dimension to the Higher Education system and orient the students to community service while they are studying in an educational institution. This is to create social consciousness among students, by establishing a meaningful linkage between the campus and the community, especially the rural community.

Admission 2022-23 UG Rules of Calicut University

Eligibility for Admission & Indexing for Ranking

Those candidates who are “Eligible for Higher Studies” as per the Higher Secondary Examination, Kerala or a pass in the equivalent examinations is the minimum criteria for admission to degree courses, unless otherwise specified. (U.O.No 2393/2015/Admn Dated:10.03.2015).

The Afsal-Ul-Ulama preliminary course is declared equivalent to the Plus Two Humanities Group. Therefore, all candidates passed Afsal -Ul-Ulama preliminary are eligible for admissions to Humanities and Commerce programmes. (GO (rt).no.2165/2014H.Edn Dated: 03.06.2014).

The candidates who have qualified the HSE and VHSE of the Government of Kerala under ‘SAY’ scheme and Compartmental Examination of CBSE are also eligible for admission to first year degree courses in the same academic year. (U.O. No. GA I /A2/ 5753/2000 dated 14.05.2004).

Bachelor of Theatre Arts/BA Music, Vocal, Veena/Mridangam/Violin : For admission to the Bachelor of Theatre Arts/BA Music, Vocal, Veena/Mridangam/Violin programmes the students should compulsorily register through the CAP. The selection will be purely based on the interview and aptitude test conducted directly by the college/centre

conducting the programme. The list of the registered candidates will be provided to the colleges and the Principals will conduct interview and aptitude test.

The candidates possessing certificate with "Eligible for Higher Studies" issued by the Kerala State Literacy Mission Authority are also eligible for Humanities and Commerce programmes. (U.O No. 408/2019/Admn Dated: 11.01.2019).

Candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary Examination of Tamil Nadu (Private study) shall not be admitted to any course under this University. (U.O.No.GAI/A1/5062/2002 dated 07.07.2005).

The physically and visually challenged candidates are not eligible for admission to Geology course. The visually challenged candidates are not eligible for admission to Science subjects (involving practical) except BCA, BSc IT and BSc Computer Science.

B. Com Finance

Eligibility : Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognised as equivalent thereto with at least one commerce subject are eligible for admissions to the B.Com degree course. Candidates who have not studied commerce subject for Higher Secondary or an equivalent examination not less than 45% marks are also eligible. A concession of 5% will be given to OBC/OEC candidates. The SC/ST candidates need get only a pass. (U.O. No.GAI/A2/1658/2007 dated 28.02.2008).

Index Mark : Total marks + 25 marks for each commerce papers subject to maximum of 50 marks.

BA English Language and Literature

Eligibility : Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission.

Index Mark : Total Marks + Twice the marks secured in English. A weightage of 20 marks will be given to those who have studies English, Functional English and Communicative English as optional subject for HSE or equivalent examination.

B.Sc. Mathematics

Eligibility : Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with Mathematics group only are eligible for admission to BSc Mathematics.

Index Mark : Total marks obtained for Part III + the marks obtained for the Mathematics for BSc Mathematics.

ADMINISTRATION

The internal Administration of the college is vested in the principal who acts in consultation with the college council.

1. The College Council shall consist of the Principal and Heads of Departments of each subject of study.
2. The Principal shall be the ex-officio President of the council. The Council shall appoint one member as the Secretary and the member so appointed shall hold office for one year, but shall be eligible for re-election.
3. The General Administration of the college shall vest in the Principal subject to the control of the Director of the Collegiate Education. Some of the General Administrative work may be entrusted to the member of the Council under the general supervision of the Principal, e.g. Library, Athletics, Maintenance of buildings and grounds etc.
4. The Council is empowered to consider and report on any question concerning accommodation, courses of instruction or rules of discipline referred to it by the Principal but shall not interfere in any manner with the General Administration of the College Which is vested in the Principal, acting under the orders of the Director of Collegiate Education.

5. All cases of serious misconduct on the part of students involving loss of their term certificate or their removal or expulsion from the College shall be dealt with by the Principal ordinarily in consultation with the College Council.

6. Meeting of the Council shall be convened at such times as the Principal may consider necessary. He shall also convene a meeting when required to do so by the Director of Collegiate Education or on the written requisition of not less than two of the members.

7. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to give notice of the meeting of the Council. to keep a record of the proceedings of such meetings and to forward to the Director of Collegiate Education through the Principal. copy of the proceedings of each meeting.
